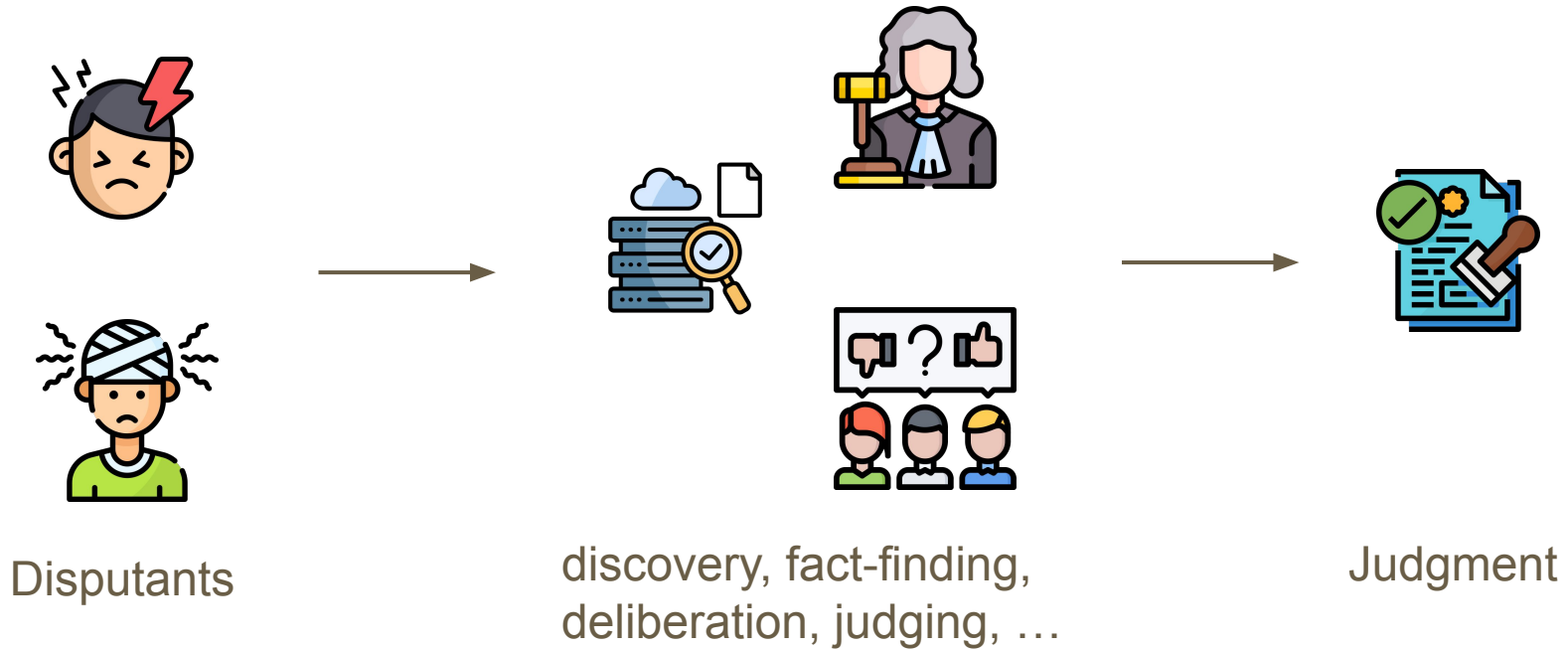

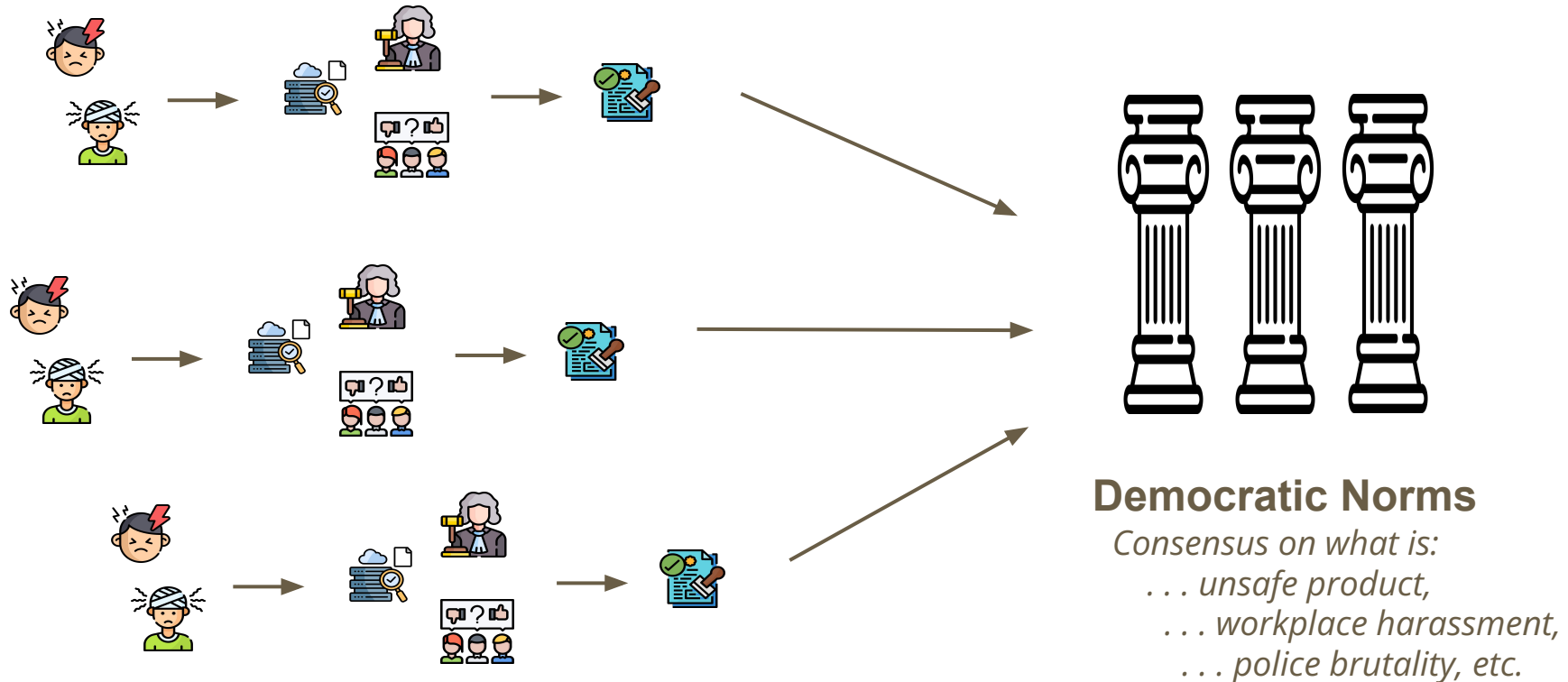

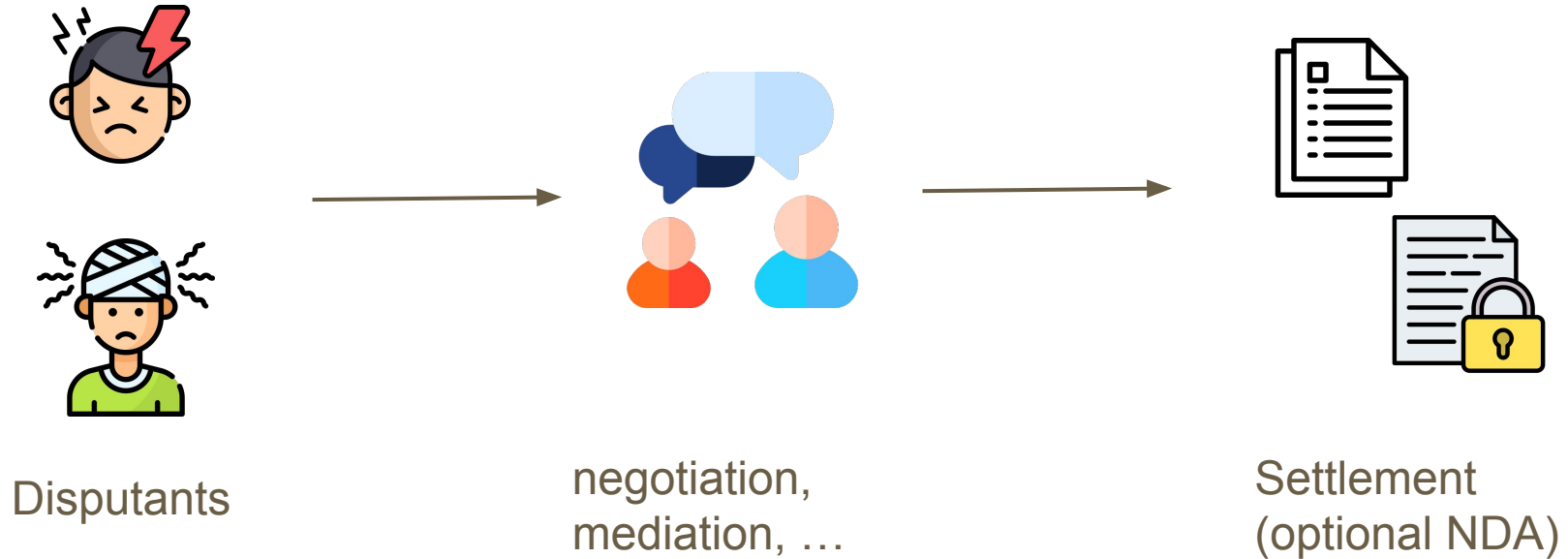
Dispute Resolution by Public Adjudication



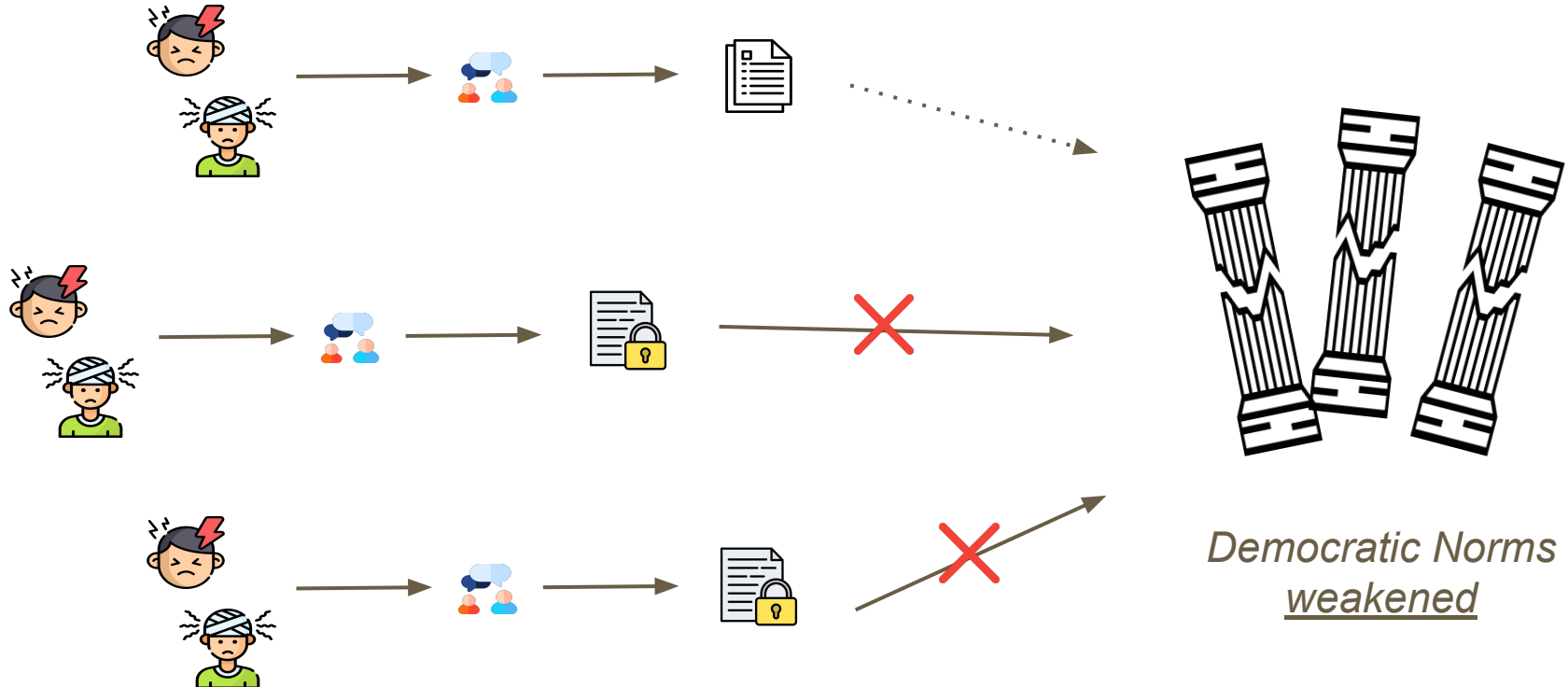
Adjudications Converging to Democratic Norms
